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What is the public good ?

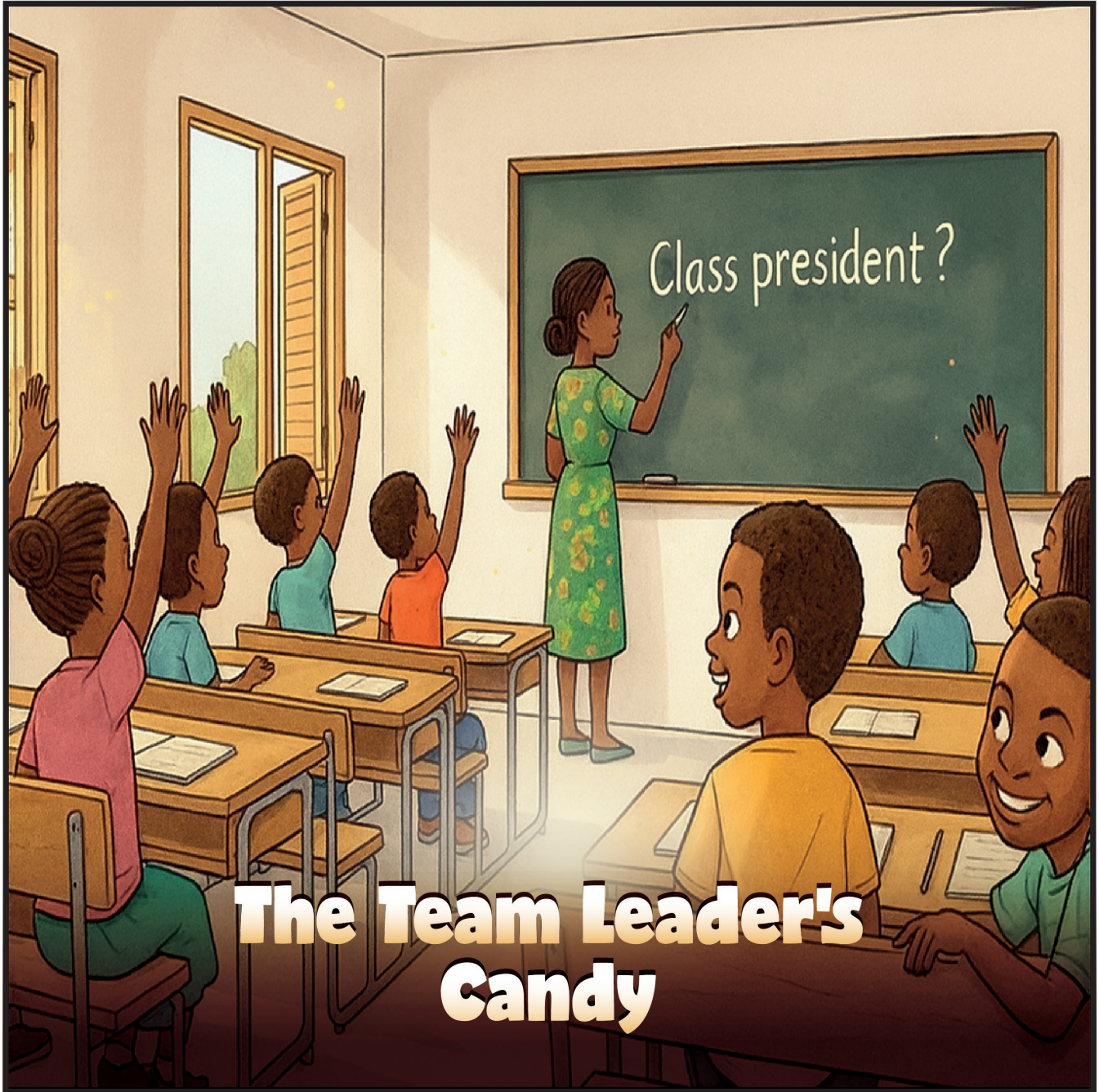

As adults, you can read this booklet with children and talk with them about the situations presented. These conversations will help them understand ideas that may be new to them.

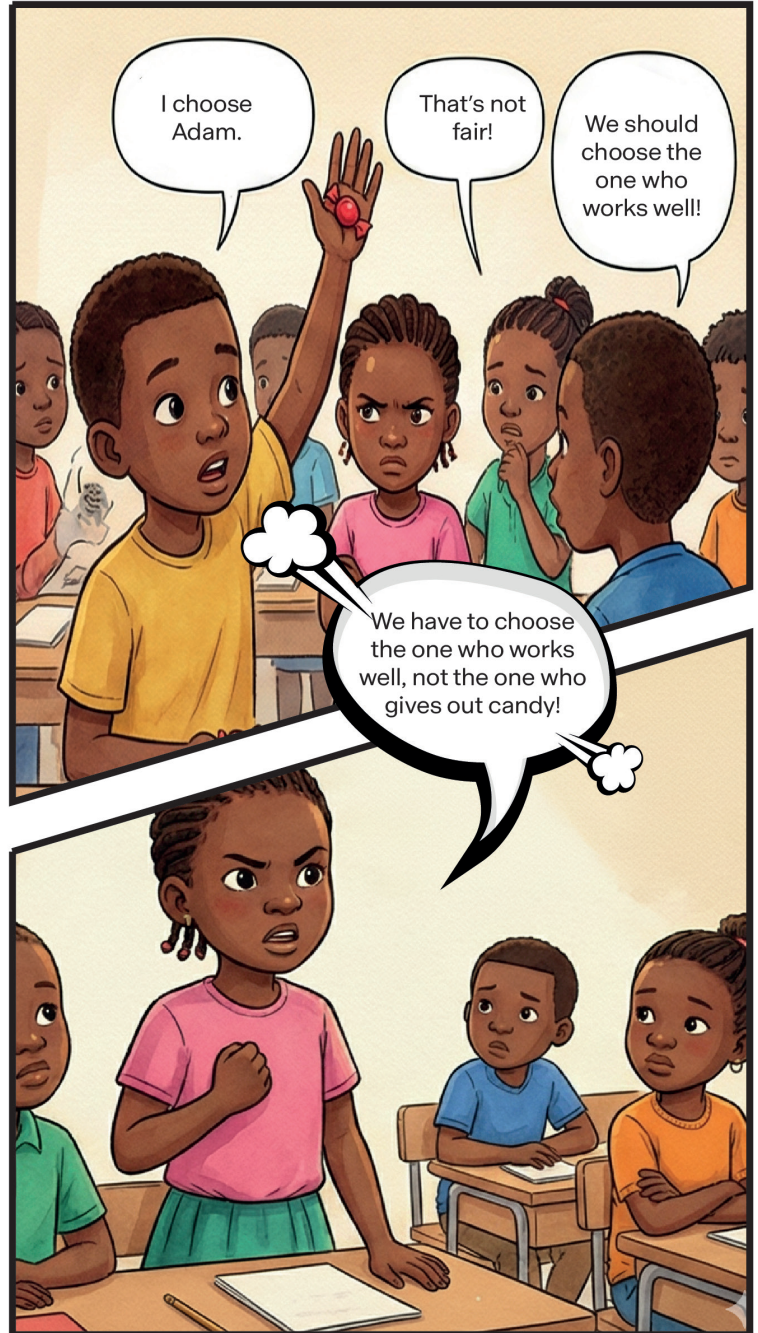
A Small Guide for Better Everyday Choices

The Team Leader's Candy

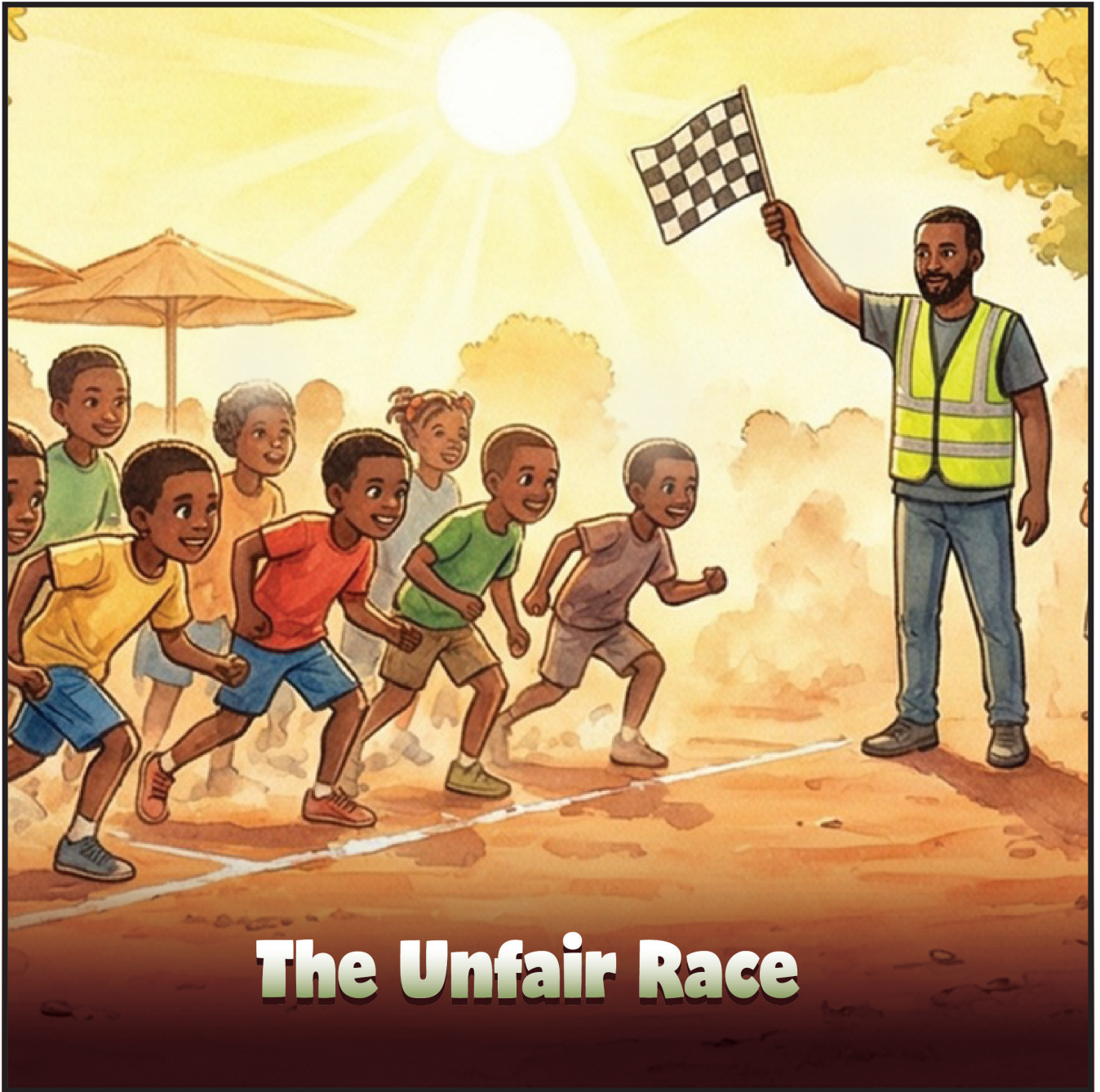




What Adam did is corruption. We do not give gifts to be chosen.

The Unfair Race

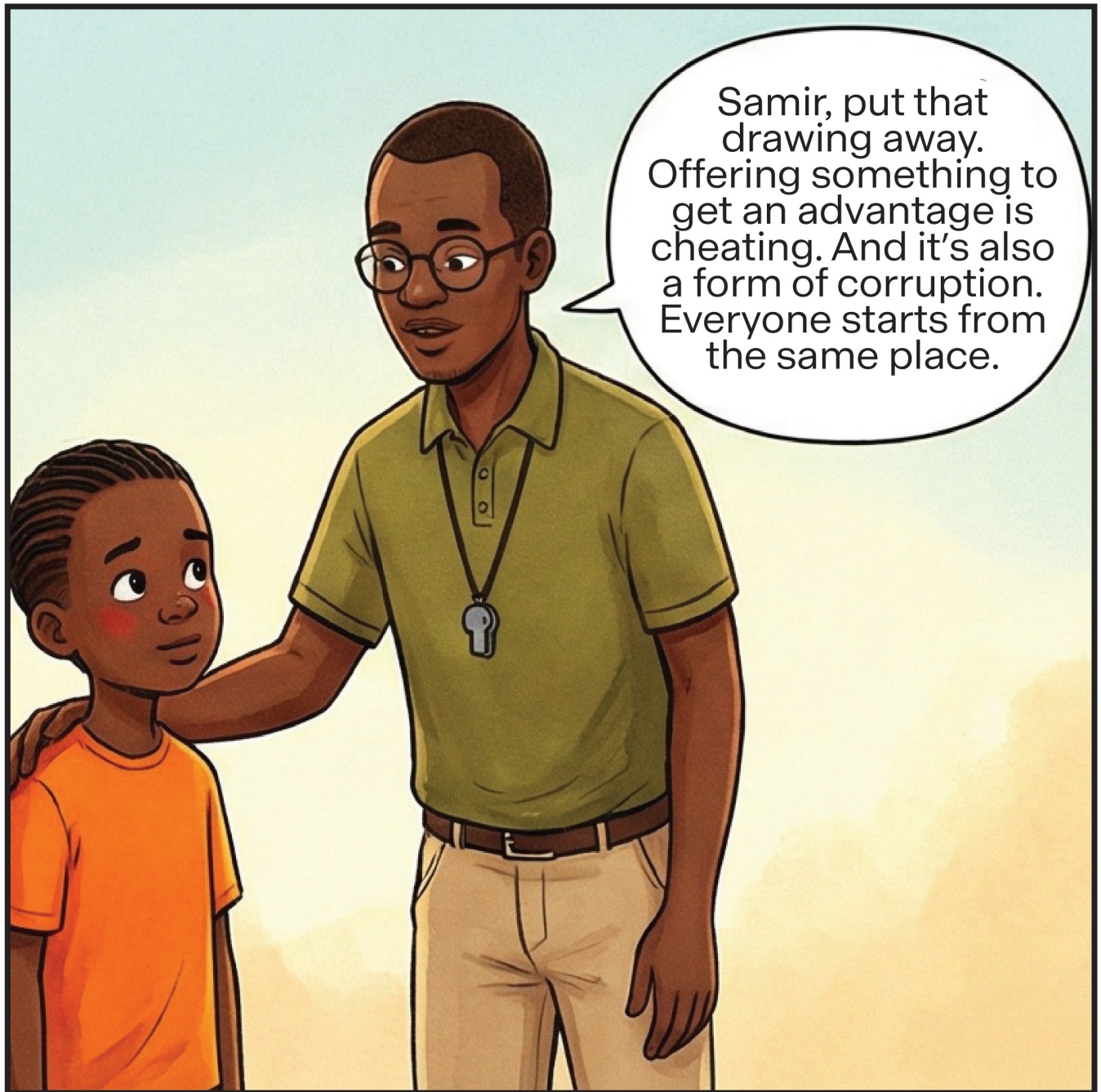




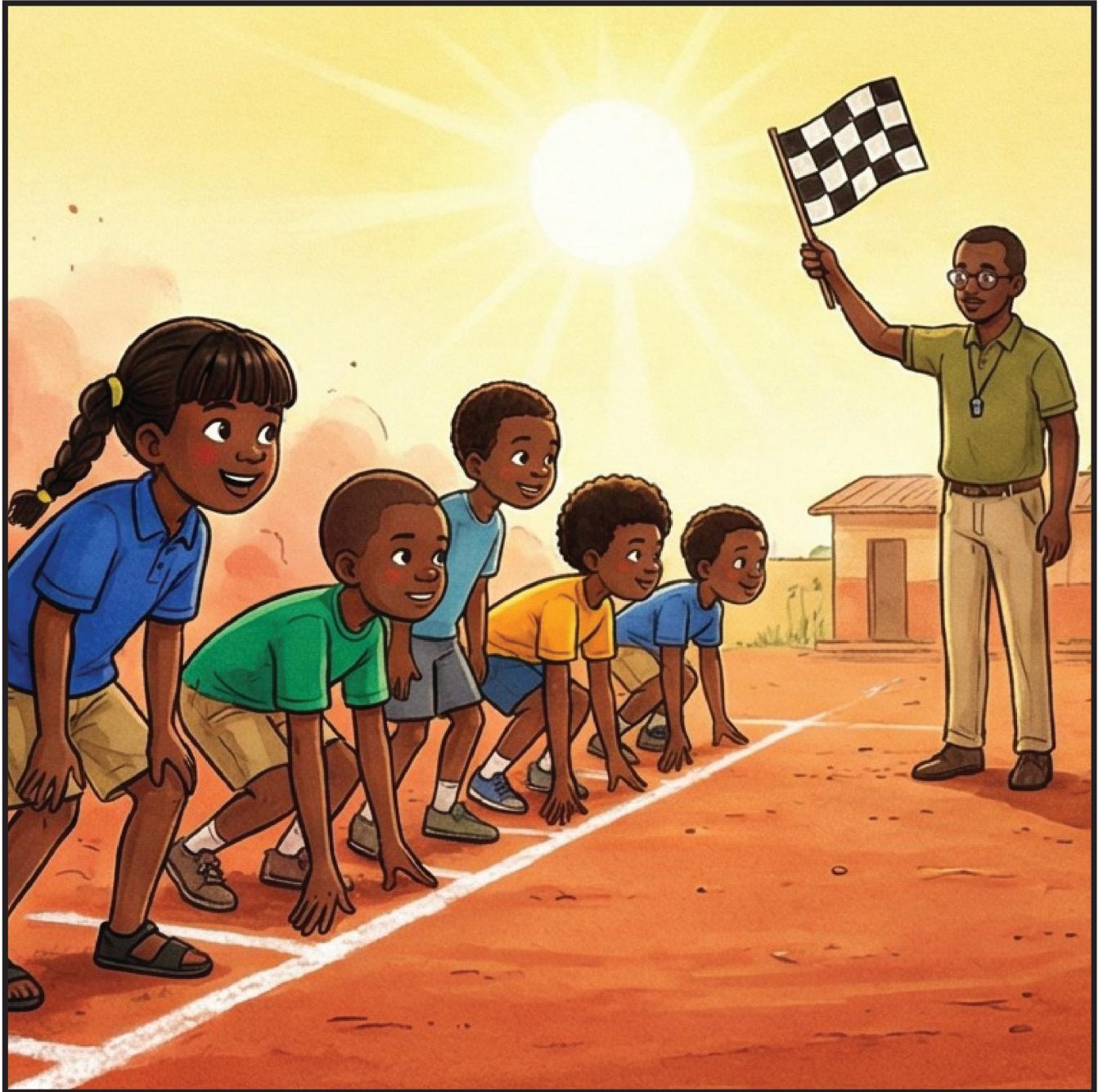
Fatou, if you let me win, I'll lend you my ball for the whole week!

Samir, put that drawing away. Offering something to get an advantage is cheating. And it's also a form of corruption. Everyone starts from the same place.

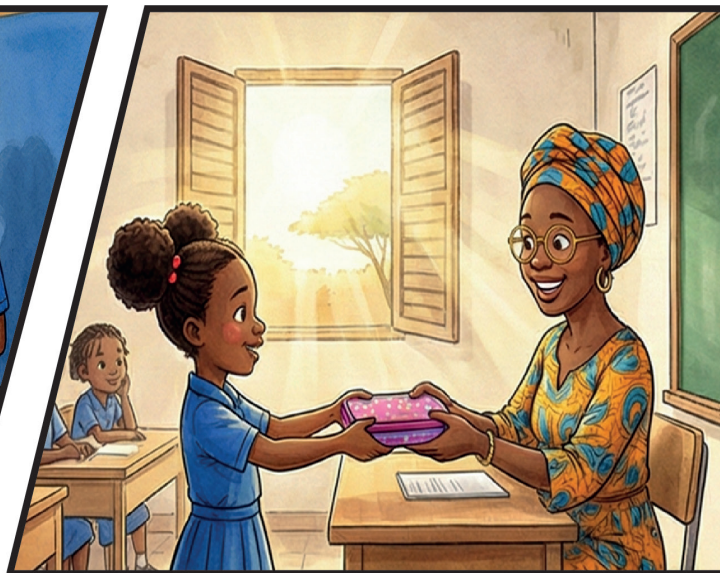




We shouldn't cheat or offer something to win. True victory, comes from being honest.
